Once again ASDA have come up trumps allowing us to collect food outside their store in the town. And once again the ASDA shoppers have responded to our pleas for tins and packets marvellously. We ended up with 30 crates jam packed with food that will be used to help create Christmas Hampers for young homeless people in our area.

What a record for our Outreach team!

Our Outreach team work alongside up to 30-35 young people at any moment in time. The role of support workers like Marina (pictured) is to help young people resolve or overcome problems they might have which may be drug, alcohol, abuse, debt, budgeting or relationship related. These need to be addressed before a client has any hope of gaining a tenancy. The support workers also help young people understand their rights and their responsibilities and assist in securing a tenancy. Once established in their tenancy the support worker will maintain regular contact to ensure the tenancy



doesn't fail and the client has a chance to build on their new start. Losing a tenancy can set someone back and even lead to a period of homelessness and sleeping rough. Looking back we realised that the last time we had a failed tenancy was nearly 5 years ago – and even that was due to a technicality. Many clients admit that, without the support of the outreach team, they would not be in the strong position they are in today and would undoubtedly have had more problems – so well done to all those involved – it's a record to be proud of and one that is helping to prevent homelessness in this area.

will continue to support young homeless people as they need to save a large amount of money over the next 3 years. However if they don't then we may see more young people sleeping rough around the town and in the outlying areas like Catshill, Sidemoor and Charford. Let's hope they recognise the need for continued support for our young people.
